



THE FEAS JOURNAL WRITING GUIDE

1- Ideal length – 800-2000 words.

Whether your article is short or long enough is an important criterion, taken into account by our Editorial Team.

2- Style – Avoid hate speech and vandalism.

Articles written in a vandalist style containing hate language are not welcomed by our editorial team.

3- Sources and References – Clarify your sources and references, especially in reviews.

If you are criticizing a specific subject in your article, carefully add your sources and references that are considered reliable at the end of the article. Criticisms that are not based on scientific data are not reviewed by our Editorial Team.

4- Topic Selection – Agenda comes first!

The FEAS Journal accepts articles in many fields such as politics, economy, international relations, sociology and history. However, articles about the world and the Türkiye agenda always have priority during publication.

5- Format Rules

5.1. - Use Times New Roman 12 points. For title writing, choose Times New Roman 16 points. The selected titles should evoke a clear idea in the reader and should not be long. The title should be written in all capital letters and bold.

5.2. - **A clear and understandable narrative method** should be preferred in accordance with the academic article format. Details **that will come out of the scope of the subject and purpose studied should not be mentioned.** By keeping scientific methods in the foreground in the preparation phase of the article; **The subject, purpose and conclusion of the study should be written sufficiently and systematically.**

6- Plagiarism, Citations and References

6.1. – The frequently used APA should be used for citations. Citations to be made in the article should be given immediately after the relevant place, in parentheses, in the order of the author's surname, publication year and page number of the work. Example: (Gelvin 2016: 28) Two works of the author published in the same year are distinguished by adding a letter to the publication year. Example: (Akin 2003a: 34), (Akin 2003b: 67)

6.2. - Footnotes are used only for mandatory explanations and are given automatically with the "FOOTNOTE" command. References here should also be arranged in parentheses with the surname of the author, publication year and page number of the work. Example: (Kaya 2000: 15) (When writing the news sites you use as a source, the last date you accessed should also be written.) Example: <https://...> Last Access Date: 12.04.2021

6.3. - **All sources used in the article should be included in the Bibliography section.** Even if they are related to the subject of the article, documents and works that are not mentioned in the article are not included in the bibliography. References should be given at the end of the main text in alphabetical order according to the surnames of the authors. Titles of works should be written in italics.
